









Climate finance 2021 by federal ministry

Bilateral climate finance 2021 by region



Germany channels **most of its climate finance** through **bilateral cooperation**. In **2021**, around **80% (€4.37 billion)** of the budget allocated to climate finance went towards bilateral cooperation; the remaining 20% (€0.97 billion) went towards the German government's multilateral activities.

Adaptation to climate change
